LADIES TARTAN SASH

Inquiries have been received regarding availability of Tartan Sashes. These sashes are generally 90" long by 10" wide and have been running about \$25.00 - \$32.00 retail, if they could be obtained in our Tartan. According to our figures, we could offer 2 1/2 yard lengths to those who wanted to hem and fringe their own. The approximate cost, including overseas postage, duty, repacking and remailing in the US would come to about \$20.00 per sash length. We are awaiting word from Myra, Scotland, to learn if she has an outlet to supply a finished product.

These are the traditional ways a sash is worn by Ladies, and bear the approval of the Lord Lyon, King of Arms.

Clanswomen wear the sash over the right shoulder fastened with a sash brooch. This is the way the sash is most often seen worn. (Turnbull women by marriage.)

Sash is worn over the right shoulder secured there with a pin and fastened with a bow on the left hip by Ladies married out of their Clan but wearing their original Clan larges. (Women who were born a Turnbull.)

they dancers or ladies desiring to keep the front of their dress clear secure the center of the sash with a button or small belt at the back of the waist. It is secured at the right shoulder by a pin or brooch so that the ends fall backwards.

Wear your Tartan Clan Sash with a hostess kilt or with a plain gown or dark skirt with white blouse.
