#### CONGRATULATIONS TO DR. BOB TURNBULL

Picture a church with sand floors, no walls or pews and palm fronds for a roof. The pastors in bright shorts, aloha shirt and barefoot, or tank top, shorts, puka shells and slippers. Hula dancers interpreting music from Bible passages translated into Hawaiian. Twenty five years ago our own Dr. Bob Turnbull founded The Waikiki Beach Chaplaincy.

Dr. Bob gave up a budding Hollywood career to become a youth minister in Hawaii. He obtained permission to hold the services at the Hilton Hotel, beside the lagoon on the side of the hotel. Bob called his disc jockey friends to get the word out. Later the Hilton asked if the ministry wanted to move to a spot on the sand in front of the hotel. The services have remained there ever since.

In February, 1970, Bob decided to take a hang-loose approach, but he didn't want to compromise the message. In the early years, rock music was provided by "The God Squad" and "Spirit Squad" to attract youths to the nondenominational Christian ministry. Today, things are a bit mellower.

Movie stars, celebrities, the foreign-born and non-Christians have joined with Christians for the informal services on the beach.

Since Bob's departure from Hawaii in 1980 the congregation has been steered by the Rev. Alex McAngus. The idea, said Bob, is to plant seeds and McAngus follows the same philospophy today. "It seems to have touched people Sunday after Sunday," says McAngus.

Bob and his wife Yvonne flew back to Hawaii to be honored and to attend the many events of the 25th anniversary.

Bob has moved his ministry to Southern California. He and Yvonne now travel the country giving talks and seminars on relationships and family.

#### BITS AND PIECES

Mark Turnbull, Auburn, NH recently purched a 40 piece tool set via mail order. When it arrived it was in a box with the name "TURNBULL TOOLS" on it. Does anyone know anything about this company?

Mark also enclosed a packet of correspondence he has received from Halbert's. This company is currently being investigated by the Consumer Protection Division of the US Postal Service, for false representation of their products.

An article appearing in the June/July 1995 issue of the Family Tree, suggests that if you purchase merchandise from this company, are not satisfied, have returned it for refund and not received said refund within 6 weeks, complain to The Consumer Protection Division, US Postal Service, 475 L'Enfant Plaza, SW, Washington, DC 20260-2100.

Mark is curious about the crest used on some of their merchandise. It depicts a shield of silver with a wheat sheaf between three black bulls' heads.

A copy of a document given to me by the late John Turnbull, Hawick, Scotland, founder of the Turnbull Clan Association, does not describe such a crest as belonging to any of the three principal Turnbull families as recorded on the 9th day of May 1759.

"The History of the Turnbull Family of Digby, Nova Scotia" by John F. Turnbull (by permission of Norman Turnbull, Orillia, Ont. Canada) shows the three Arms of the Turnbull's mentioned in the document.

"Turnbull of Badinruell (Bedrule) Argent, three bull's heads erased sable armed vert. Blazon taken from Pont's Manuscript, A Collection of Arms Made by James Pont, A.D. 1624.

The Arms of John Turnbull of Strickcathrow, descended of the familie of Baderule bears Argent three bull heads erased sable armed vert within a bordur indented of YE (i.e. The) second above shield ane helmet befitting his degree mantled gules doubled Argent the motto in ane escroll Audaci Favet Fortuna. Blazon taken from the Public Register of All Arms and Bearings in Scotland, Volume 1, p. 431, circa 1767.

John Turnbull of Know descended of the familie of Minto bears Argent ane ear of rye vert betwixt three bulls heads erased sable armed of the second: above the shield ane helmet befitting his degree mantled gules doubled Argent: next is placed on ane torse for his crest a bulls head cabossed as the former, the motto in an escroll Courage." Blazon taken from the Public Register of All Arms and Bearings in Scotland, Volume 1, p. 431, circa 1767. See illustrations on p. 5.

"I SAVED THE KING (the Story of the Turnbulls)" by R. E. Scott

"Family names frequently suggest the symbols to be used in a coatof-arms, such as the "strong arm" of the Armstrongs, or other distinguishing emblems associated with an individual or clan. The armorial bearing chosen by the original Turnbull was ready made and, surely, could have been none other than a bull's head, qualified by the reminder "I SAVED THE KING."

The Turnbulls of Philiphaugh, Bedrule and Minto, Bishop Turnbull on his episcopal seal and the carved stone in Jedburgh Abbey and Glasgow Cathedral used the same arms of one bull's head.

Sometime during the 18th century the Turnbulls of Minto changed to three bulls' heads and the slogan "Courage."


In 1759 a branch of the Bedrule family adopted the three heads and the motto "Audaci Favet Fortuna" (Fortune Favours the Brave.)

While walking around the churchyard at Bedrule Church you will see many tombstones bearing the Turnbull crest with the bull's head.

Bedrule Church is very near the site of Bedrule Castle, now just a grass covered mound above the steep right bank of the Rule River. When we first visited the area we asked a woman living nearby if this was indeed the location of Bedrule Castle and her very picturesque reply was, " 000 aye, doon ther amongst the coos." So we picked our way amongst the cows and stood atop the mound and picked up some stones for a keepsake. Didn't notice any bulls there at the time but there were plenty of cows.

#### GENEALOGY HELPS

Cousin problem finally solved. The Carroll Co. Genealogy Society Newsletter has a way to help solve the problem of cousinship. They say to ask yourself what ancestor you and your cousin have in common? If it was a grandparent, you are FIRST COUSINS. If it was a great grandparent, you are SECOND COUSINS. If it was a 2-great grandparent, you are THIRD COUSINS. If it was a 3-great grandparent, you are FOURTHE COUSINS. And, if your father or mother was a third cousin of someone, for instance, you are that person's third cousin once removed, not his or her fourth cousin. ## New Design for TWC Label

fter many long months of viewing prototypes, debating over the best. making changes and sending the designers back to the drawing table, we have finally decided on the new Turnbull label

This version of the bull comes from an ancient Minoan drinking vessel and, although he has little resemblance to the old bull, he is — please note — lurning. When you have the opportunity to see the label up close, you can find the old guy blindembossed on the lower righthand side, his place of honor.

For those of you who may not be familiar with the story behind the name "Turnbull," it is taken from a legend about a Scottish king's hunting expedition. When he came face to face with a wild bull, one of his retainers grabbed the creature's horns and turned

it away. The grateful ruler dubbed his subject "Turnbull," and awarded him a crest featuring a bull's head twisted back. The crest bears the motto: Audaci Favet Fortuna, or "Fortune Favors the Bold."

The first cabernet sauvignon to sport the new label will be the 1992 vintage scheduled for release in late summer. We think the new version is a standout and hope you agree.

The 1991 Cabernet is the last to carry the Johnson Turnbull label.
