

### WHERE TO START: Part 1

It is always best to plan on how to start, where it is going to take you, and what are you going to do with it, after it has been gathered.

Start with you and your family first, move to your parents, and siblings. Ask your parents about their parents, siblings, stories, look at old letters and Bibles. See if there are any old journals or diaries and check out the photo albums.

You should then plan on seeing and speaking with the oldest of the living relatives. I personally found, that trying to take notes on paper is distracting for everyone. Tidbits of important information could be missed. A tape recorder is ideal, put in a place where the sound is easily picked up, but not a distraction to the individuals. Conversation should be casual and comfortable, leading up to questions about the family. Older folks like to reminisce and that's the idea you want to work with, letting them talk freely about the olden days. They might ramble on and on, in the rambling comes the jewels of information. Every time you listen to the tapes, you could find something that you might have missed. Identifying the voices on the tape, is really simple, just make sure that you ask the question, by directing that question to Aunt Jess, Uncle Tom, or Granny. Many visits might be necessary, but usually that's good, because we all love our older generation.

Now you have some information, so what are you going to do with the data? You will need a notebook, files, or if you have a computer, a program designed for Genealogy data. The one thing I cannot stress strongly enough, is the source of your information. When I first started, no one told me the importance of writing it down in notes. The main thing to remember about your notes is that after you are gone and another generation is reading what you have entered, you want them to enjoy what they are reading and learning about their ancestors, and you, but also where you got all the information.

A good place to go searching, is a visit your local Library or the Latter Day Saints Library. They have books telling about available films, file cabinets full of there accumulated data from Church records, and the International Genealogy Index, IGI for short.

There is a Turnbull Family Genealogy Forum, that has a lot of persons looking for their family connections. Take a look at....
