Arthur A. Turnbull. Died Friday March 15, 2002, age 93, of 11 Gibbons Street, Dekalb Junction. Mr. Turnbull was a night engineer for more than 23 years at Pioneer Borden Plant at Gouverneur. Born July 21, 1908, in Gouverneur the son of Guy A. and Anna B Pickert Turnbull. He attended School there, served in the Army Air Force and Military Police group 984 during World War II.

His first wife was Beatrice Ferguson, they divorced, then he married Lillian MacKenzie in 1943. He is survived by his wife, 2 sons John and Roderick and there wives. Three daughters and families, Nine Grandchildren, nieces and nephews. Three brothers Culver, Weldon and Guy Jr, a sister Isabel Merritt, deceased before him, as are his parents.

Funeral was held at Allen-Denesha Funeral Home, With the Rev. Robert L. Graham officiating. And laid to rest at East DeKalb Cemertery.

Donations were made to the DeKalb Chamber of Commerce and the DeKalb Historical Association.

Efforts are being made to locate the author Michael Robson, who was writing the book on TURNBULLS. If anyone has an old address for him it would be greatly appreciated.
