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Hello Everyone,

Well, it appears that our little experiment in old tyme writing did not go well. I expected that! I was showing you how hard it is to read old records. Should you at some time decide to go to Scotland to the parish of your ancestor, and asked to see the old documents, this little experiment was to give you a sample of what you might find there. I am going to enclose TIME CAPSULE in this issue, it is a copy of an old Turnbull Document. This document was sent to Dorothy Berk by our Scottish founder John F. Turnbull. The translation of the document is on the back side. It was made in 1759, you will note the damage done by age and that at some time it had been folded, it was written by an educated man with a fairly descent handwriting and it was most likely originally on parchment. The shield has damage in the middle, should have three bulls heads, the helmet has a bulls head on the top. Remember that the older the records, the more damage you are going to find, from aging paper or parchment, improper handling and care, water, mold, poor writing and splotches of ink from the drips off the quill pens, and the spelling of some words was different then.

Terry Trimble of Tennessee has volunteered to head up a DNA project. This is the coming of age in Genealogy. It takes a look at not only our DNA strings, and how we are all similar in some manner but the diseases that follow family lines. Hereditary genetics for example in my family, I have allergies to pollens and grasses, three of my children have then also. 

## A TRUE ACCOUNT AND DESCRIPTION OF THE ORIGINAL OF THE NAME AND ARMS OF TURNBULL


During our visit to Hawick, Scotland in 1981, John Turnbull, our late founder gave me a copy of the document which appears on page 4. It is very old and hard to read but a great keepsake. A faint outline of the arms can be seen.

With the aid of a magnifying glass and some patience I was able to decipher that which appears on page 5. There are a few missing pieces undoubtedly some errors and emissions and anything you members can add would be appreciated. It would be an addition to our files to have this document as complete as possible.

The question is often asked, "With three crests, why did the Turnbull Clan Association pick the Turnbull of Bedrule crest and motto?" The charter members did the choosing. They felt that the crest and motto which appears on the Scotland of Old map was more widely known. Also, since we are all supposedly descended from William (Roull) Turnbull of Bedrule, and most are not that sure which of the other lines they are related to, one had to be chosen to represent all.

On a personal basis, many of the members have mementos passed down thru the families which identify the line to which they specifically belong. When John Turnbull our late founder was consulted he thought the choice should be up to the members. The main purpose at the time was to get organized and get the basics attended to. To this date, no one has really voiced a word of total disagreement. There is no Clan chief from whom to get direction, perhaps that will change one day.

### A TRUE ACCOUNT AND DESCRIPTION OF THE ORIGINAL OF THE NAME AND ARMS OF TURNBULL

The following true account and description of the original of the name and arms of Turnbull was taker from the Standard Bock of Scots Heraldry in the British Herald office at Doctor's Commons in London, the 9th day of May 1759 by the proper Clerk in that office in my presence, and from the following description the principal Limner in said office made a drawing of the Arms properly coloured, which I caused to be engraved on a copper plate by one of the best Engravers in London. An impression of which is here exhibited all at the desire and expense of me James Turnbull. Then Clerk to Robert Dundas of Armiston Esq. His Majesty's Advocate for Scotland and Member of Parliment for the Shire of Edinburgh.

(If you look closely you can make out part of the motto Favet and an indented border. The rest is not very clear.)

The Heads of Bulls are frequent in Arms and as all other Heads of which before represents the whole creature.

The Name of Turnbull carried Argent a Bull's head erased sable, of late three of them dispersed 2 and 1.

The first of the Name with us was a strong man of the Name of Ruel who turned around a Bull by the head which violently ran against King Robert Bruce in Stirling Park for which he got from that King the Lands of Badyruel in Teviotdale and the Name of Turnbull.

Edward Howes in his history of England page 231 mentions this man in the minority of King David Bruce at the Battle of Polydownhill his words are "To certain stout champion of great stature who for a fact done' by him was "Called Turnbull - advanced before the Scotts Army and a great mastive dog with him, and challenged any of the English army to fight with him a combat. One Sir Robert Venala Norfolk man by the King of England leave, took him up, and killed him and his dog too.

This gentleman's son Sir James Turnbull with, Sir John Halyburton were killed near Nisbet Muir in the Merse in an engagement with the English. Anno 1355 for which see Abercrombies History - Vol. 2 Page 105.

I have seen the Armorial of Turnbull of Minto appended to a Charter of 1455 (Penis Comiston de Homis) which had only one Bull's head, and that cabosed. Of late this of that Name multiply the Heads to three.

John Turnbull of Strickcathrow descended off the family of Badyruel, carries Argent three Bull's Heads erased, Motto (Audaci Favet Fortuna) New register.

John Turnbull of Know, descendent off the Family of Minto carried Argent one ear of Rye vert between three Bull's Heads, erased sable armed of the Second Crest a Bull s head cabosed, sable vert Motto "Courage".
