"Dear Cousin John..."

That's how it all started. That is how my father, Byron Turnbull met John Turnbull of Hawick, Scotland, towards the end of December 1967. It was also how my father became involved in the Turnbull Clan Association.

From my dad's writings:


It was around October 1967, and I was feeling "puny" with a cold. My buddy, Phil Chamberlain and I were to have lunch, and one look at me convinced him I was ill. He offered me a sample of medication he had just received which was just what I needed for my particular problem...except the medication dropped my blood pressure out from under me and I fell on my head. It turned out I had a drug reaction, and my buddy Phil reported this reaction to the LaRoche-Hoffman Pharmaceutical Company, and within several weeks I received a call from Dr. John Pepper, their medical representative, wanting to interview me. Days later we had lunch together at Merritt Hospital (\*note; dad was Chief of Oral Surgery for 22 years at Samuel Merritt Hospital in Oakland.) and during our conversation he informed me he had a very dear friend in Hawick, Scotland, named John Turnbull. That afternoon when I returned to my office, I wrote a letter which started "Dear Cousin John..."

Towards the end of December 1967, I received a letter from John Turnbull, dated December 7th. It was written on aged paper with a wide green letterhead advertising Turnbull Whisky with the date of 1890 something. John explained that his grandfather being a thrifty Scot had ordered too much letterhead and well... he just "hadn't got through it yet."

From that point on, it was letters, tapes, packages and home movies that brought our two families together. My mom and dad first met John and Myra in person in September 1973, on a trip to Hawick. John and Myra reciprocated a couple of years later on a trip to California. All this led to my father's jump into the Turnbull Clan Association, full throttle! I remember my father being in his den at home, for hours at a time, corresponding with John and Myra with ideas. Dorothy Turnbull-Burke and many others shared the same enthusiasm and passion that has all brought us all together. My father saved almost everything; letters from other TCA members, inquiring members to be; swatches for the Turnbull tartans; pictures of other TCA family members and letters of genealogical interest to see just how close our fore-fathers' paths have crossed. I saw such

excitement in my father when he talked about TCA. His happiness was so apparent when sharing news of TCA and this passion of his with others.

How much smaller this world has gotten for all of us since then! We really all are "cousins," aren't we?



#### **Information Needed: Gregor McGregor Turnbull**

The following request came from Dr David Hay Honorary Senior Research Fellow Department of Divinity and Religious Studies, King's College, Aberdeen University, Scotland

I am an academic researching material for a biography and I have a query about Gregor McGregor Turnbull who died of Yellow Fever in Trinidad in 1881. He was the son of Gregor Turnbull, a wealthy Glasgow merchant who owned numerous sugar plantations in Trinidad. Young Gregor married Elizabeth Hannah Clavering in Glasgow in 1880 and (I assume) they sailed for Trinidad shortly after the wedding. The story is tragic and is described in the Port of Spain Gazette for 20 August 1881 as "a sad, sad case" for apparently Gregor caught Yellow Fever and within two days had died. And thus "Mrs Turnbull was a wife, a mother, childless, and a widow in less than one short year". The issue for 27 August severely criticized the doctor, a Dr De Wolf, for abandoning his patient and leaving him to die in agony."

Has any member of the Turnbull clan got information or historical records that would provide a more detailed account of this story? Elizabeth survived, returned to Britain and married again, this time to a Nottingham architect called Richard Hardy. They had three sons, one of whom was Alister Clavering Hardy who was to become a world famous marine biologist and Professor of Zoology at Oxford University. I am writing his biography and am keen to find out as much detail as I can about his forebears. I would be most grateful for any help that may be available.



(continued from page 1) "It will be good to get the track named after Derek," MacIntosh said. "That's where Derek used to train before he went overseas to set all those world records he used to set."

Turnbull broke 25 age-group world records as a veteran runner, six of which were broken in 1992 when he was 66. Many of those records still stand.



He won 28 gold medals at world veteran track and field championships and in the 1989 World Masters won six golds.

In 1997, at 71, he ran the 10km track race in 39min 43sec and the 10km cross country in 38.23.69. MacIntosh expects more than 100 people to attend Saturday's ceremony, which

starts at 1.30pm with speeches and an unveiling of new signage on the track at the Tussock Creek entrance.

Athletes from around the country had signaled their intention to be involved, and members of Turnbull's family would also be in attendance. A walk or run over the track, which is about 5 km long, would then be staged, followed by refreshments provided by the Department of Conservation.

# Oatmeal Gingerbread (from Scottish Tea Time Recipes, compiled by Johanna Mathie)

6 oz flour

2 oz oatmeal

2 oz soft brown sugar

2 oz butter

2 Tbl black treacle ( or molasses)

1 t ground ginger

1 t allspice

1 large egg

1 level teaspoon baking soda

2 Tbl milk

Set oven to 350°. Grease a 7" square baking pan. Put butter, sugar and treacle in saucepan and heat gently until melted. Add the oatmeal and spices to the flour and baking soda. Add the treacle mixture, beaten egg and milk. Stir well. Pour into pan and bake 45 min. Cool 10 minutes and remove from pan.

# Seeing Is Understanding In Cheboygan, Michigan

An open house was hosted by Debra Turnbull, executive director of the Cheboygan Youth Center. The Youth Center was established almost 11 years ago. The center is available to students in grades five through nine. "Basically, we want to make people aware of what is here...There are still people who are not aware of the center if they do not have a child of that age... Until they see it, it's a bit difficult to understand. Seeing is understanding," says Turnbull.

Visiting and seeing first hand will help the members of the community understand the positive impact the center has on kids. The open house is from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. Monday at the Youth Center, located on Division Street adjoining the Cheboygan Area School District administrative offices.

Turnbull said the center provides a fun setting in which children can develop social skills while taking part in athletic, creative and educational programs. "The most common comment we hear is that people are not aware that there is so much to do here," Turnbull said.

She wants to show off what is offered. Included in that is a new intervention program that focuses on families of at-risk youth. "Research shows that with kids at this age, if they have difficulties, it's hard for them to dig out of," Turnbull explained. "We want to prevent these kinds of problems. When we discover someone is struggling, we work with the whole family to help them get out of the situation. Judge Butts sponsored the pilot program and now we have eight families involved. We teach kids the skills they need here, and if we see they need more help, we are here to help the whole family."

Turnbull would like to see more senior citizens team up with some of the youth; a situation she believes would benefit all involved. "If you have a kid who is lonely and doesn't have a lot of interaction, and you have a senior citizen who is in the same situation - maybe he/she just lost a spouse - we would like for them to have a conversation or do an activity together," Turnbull said. "Sort of a grandparent-type program. It would be a plus for the youth and the senior citizen."

She also wants to hear concerns, comments and suggestions from the community. She noted that comments have resulted in great ideas in the past.

Cheboygan, MI is located in Michigan's Cheboygan county, about 186.3 miles from Flint and 189.9 miles from Green Bay.
