Monumental Task Begins

Artist Angela Hunter reports that a facility has been obtained to house the larger than life monument as the *Turning of the Bull* Monument begins to take form. Larger than anything Angela has done before, her normal workspace was not big enough for the creation of the monument. Angela spent several weeks looking for just the right place to begin work. Not only does Angela need floor space for such a piece, she needs head room, as she will be required to "hang" from various angles in order to create the entire statue. The statue will be approximately 6' x 8' when completed.

Angela says that the next step is to create the armature for William Rule. Angela will keep us posted on the progress of the monument. She will send photos as the work advances depicting the various stages of the work.

The *Turning of the Bull* monument is due to be unveiled during the 2009 Spring Reivers' Festival in Hawick, Scotland. The monument will be situated in the open yard of the Hawick Heritage Hub.

The year was 1977 and the man was John F. Turnbull of Hawick. Scotland. John founded Turnbull Clan Association to reestablish a link with Turnbulls worldwide and their rich heritage. Working endlessly with his wife Myra as his personal assistant, the two wrote letters and addressed envelopes by hand, mailing to any Turnbull worldwide that they could find. 2007 commemorated the 30th anniversary of the Turnbull Clan Association. To celebrate, the Annual General Meeting took place in Scotland where the organization founded.

The Glasgow University tour was made extra special with a performance from their renowned choir.




