

Wish Upon a Dream was founded by Lesley Turnbull in 2007. The aim of the non-profit organization is to enable terminally ill and sick children from the Isle of Man, UK to fulfill some of their ambitions and dreams.



The charity recently granted a wish celebrating its first anniversary. Six children experienced a flight over the Island. The children ranged in age from four to thirteen. They are sick or in remission for their conditions. They were able to get a bird's eye view of

their schools and homes as they flew above the Island. Also on board was founder, Lesley Turnbull.

The wish was granted through the arrangements of Ms. Turnbull and courtesy of Manx2. Lesley said, "It is our first birthday – a year since we granted our first wish and it coincided with Manx2's birthday." Manx2 chairman Noel Hayes said, "It has been really nice to do something for the kids and give them a few moments of happiness...it has been a great and uplifting experience because it's given a chance to put something back and I think days like this make everyone realize really how fortunate people are in life."

Last year one of the wishes granted was for Joseph. "Mid 2007 saw our first wish being granted to Joseph. He suffers from a condition known as 'Spinal Muscular Atrophy Type II' and is confined to wheelchair. A close family friend nominated Joseph for his wish of a spa that would aid and relax his muscles and allow him home water therapy whenever he needed it. A 'Softub' developed in America has transformed his everyday life. With help from Swales of Laxey the wish happened. It requires various water treatments to keep the water right at all times and Swales are on hand to deal with any problems that may arise. Joseph knew nothing of the nomination or what was happening in an extension to his home and all delivered courtesy of Phoenix Logistics.

The day of the surprise came and Joseph's face was a picture of joy and delight, his new spa with coloured, underwater lighting was exactly right. This was as amazing for his parents, to know that their son could have this water therapy treatment in the home, their faces a picture. Joseph is such a lovely child and very deserving of his wish, that is in constant use."

## Could You Be Related To . . .

James Turnbull, a private soldier of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Regiment of Guards? Before answering or delving too far perhaps it would be wise to learn more about this soldier Turnbull. He is not known for his heroic patriotism. His fame comes from a different sort of heroic act.

James Turnbull robbed the National Mint in the Tower of London the 25<sup>th</sup> of February 1799. A private soldier of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Regiment of Guards, he received orders on the 20<sup>th</sup> of December 1798 to work in the die in the coinage of guineas. At 9:00 in the morning, James pretended to go with the other men to breakfast.

James, in fact, did not stay at breakfast. He returned from breakfast after only a minute or two with a fellow comrade named Dalton. Dalton stood at the door while James put a pistol to the head of an apprentice named Finch, who had been left in care of the coining room. A Mr. Chambers was also present.

James demanded the key to the chest where the finished guineas were deposited. Mr. Chambers attempted to interfere. With the pistol now leveled at his forehead, he and Finch were pushed down a passage leading to another room into which they were forced and consequently locked.

James then opened the chest and removed four bags, containing two thousand three hundred and eighty guineas and proceeded to escape with them before any alarm could be made. He managed to elude detection for a fortnight, but was discovered on the 5<sup>th</sup> of January, at Dover, when he attempted to hire a boat to carry him to France.

With the evidence against him, he acknowledged himself to be guilty of the robbery and when called to make his defense was immediately found guilty by the jury. He was sentenced to death and instantly replied, "I have now heard my sentence, and I thank God for it."

James Turnbull was tried and convicted on the 25<sup>th</sup> of February, 1799. He was executed on the 15<sup>th</sup> of May before Newgate. So, is James in your family line? And if so, will you admit it?

Alastair Crantson is designing a Turnbull Trails tour from 4-6 days that begins with the monument dedication and continues throughout Borderlands. Alastair was one of our guides for the 2007 trip and I can vouch for his ability and knowledge of the Borders and the Turnbulls.
