CA welcomes you to 1 a new year and a new look to our online presence. Webmaster and TCA vice-president Brian Turnbull has been working hard to launch the new web site design for January 2009.

The new design includes photo slide shows as well as links to other sites with audio, video and news of interest to Turnbulls worldwide. Interested visitors are encourage to register. By registering, one is acknowledging an interest and will be able to keep up with special news updates during the year.



Members may register to access the Members Only section which gives admittance to current Bullseye Publications, the Bullpen and other items that membership accords. (See Bullpen update on page 6.)

The site is a wealth of information containing news about Turnbulls, origins, Highland Games activities and more. Included on the site is the largest existing Turnbull genealogy search engine. The genealogy section has over 56,000 names and has been accessed by over 20,000 people.

One of the nicest new features is a search box found at the top right of the page. This allows the visitor to search for particular information or perhaps a person's name. The re-

sults display any articles or pages relevant

to the search.

Be sure to check out the Features section. Members are encouraged to submit items for the Virtual Museum or art gallery. Another fun area is the Media section. The Images tabs contain members photo albums with some beautiful pictures including many of the Borders in Scotland. 




9:11:01 by George Turnbull


