## TWO BEST FRIENDS CELEBRATING 1ST HALLOWEEN

In the earliest times of Celtic circles, the 1st November, has celebrated All Saints Day in Ireland, Scotland, Wales and the Isles of Man.

All Saints Eve was established in the eighth century. It was also known as All Hallows Eve, which has now changed and recognised worldwide as Hallowe'en or Halloween; the beginning of the three-day observance of Allhallowtide.

Despite these name changes, many traditional habits have survived long into the Christian era to this day. It is a time of celebrating the ending of one harvest season and the beginning of a new one. All Hallows Eve conjured up the supernatural and many customs are still practiced in certain circles today. Halloween is an important event on the calendar.

Pagan witchcraft added to these Celtic beliefs. It was also a time of remembering the departed loved ones. This involved setting up an empty chair in a quiet corner, together with a small plate of food for the invisible guests when they visited the house, one hour before midnight. In some areas, bonfires were lit to keep the evil spirits away.

Children dressed in old clothes so that they would not be conspicuous on the eve and could venture out safely without being

detected by wicked ghouls. In groups, they would visit the poor and other families, singing and handing out Pour Cakes as gifts. Moreover, hollowed out turnips and pumpkins for the observance were used as scary lighting.

On the eve, children also celebrated with parties and dancing as well as having fun with popular games. Apple dookin' involved having their hands tied behind their backs while trying to grab an apple by the mouth from a water filled tub.

Another popular game involved trying to eat treacle scones suspended by string. Participants were blindfolded and with their hands tied, the challenge ended with very messy faces. urning was yet another pastime for predictions.



## THE TURNBULL/TRIMBLE DNA PROJECT

In 1991 the Turnbull Clan Association decided to support Dr Michael Robson in his development of a history of the Turnbulls. Dr Robson was then editor of the Clan's newsletter and former Curator at Wilton Lodge.


As a founding member of the Borders Family History Society, he was well known among genealogists and took a special interest in the Turnbulls.

His many years of research resulted in six completed chapters and plans for as many as fifteen more before his death in 2017. Recently his widow, Janet, contacted TCA about having the work completed and published and

Fiona Turnbull was asked to look into supporting this venture.

After two trips to Janet's home in the Outer Hebrides, Fiona brought home five boxes of Dr Robson's notes and research. Sorting through a box of correspondence she was surprised to see some familiar handwriting that belonged to her 2nd cousin Kitty Turnbull.

Kitty had met Dr. Robson at the first Turnbull Clan gathering in Hawick and wanted to provide him with details of her family line. Fiona shared some of the 1830s letters that Kitty had saved at this year's AGM and was surprised to see photocopies of them in an envelope sent to Dr Robson.



A loose photo in the box was also familiar. It was the family coat of arms representing both the Turnbulls and Weddells the original of which is with her brother's family.

Other familiar letter writers included Albert Turnbull of Gateshead who included his now well-known Turnbulls of Tyneside lineage. In fact many Turnbulls wrote to Dr Robson to supply him with additional information about various branches of the Turnbull family.

Dr Robson's plan was to cover 1100-1700 and to arrange the chapters largely by parish and to concen-

trate on Roxburghshire. To quote from his original publicity:

"The story of the Turnbulls begins with a discussion of the name itself and its origins – not forgetting the episode with the bull – and its first recorded appearance in the Borders. The scene is then set with a description of the land of the Turnbulls and the places with which the main families were associated.

The little known valley of the Rule Water, a river that rises close to the Border, was the home of the 'chief' Turnbull, who had his residence at Bedrule, and also of many of his relatives and supporters, who were members of neighbouring families occupying at one time most of the farms in the area.

Another leading line of Turnbulls lived at Minto, on the north side of the River Teviot opposite the Rule Water, and principal branches becames established immediately to the east and west. Curiously, one of the oldest Turnbull groups was outside this heartland at Selkirk." alone.

#### DNA NEWS - MEMBERSHIP IS GROWING

This year we have seen some exciting growth in the number of members in the DNA project.

So far we have 136 members with 7 joining in the last month alone. Some of the geographic lines opening up include Carlisle, Linlithgow, and hopefully the mysterious John Turnbull of the Coromandel line in Australia. There has been kit request that should link up Dr. Andrew Turnbull of New Smyrna Beach fame too.

As a reminder we accept both the yDNA or FamilyFinder kits only available through FTDNA and autosomal kits from *ancestry.com*, *23andMe*, or **MyHeritage** which can be transferred at no additional cost. FTDNA runs sales during the holiday season that include upgrades so if you have only taken a 12 or 25 marker Ytest then this is the time to upgrade for better results.

The ancient traditions of marking the end of one Celtic harvest year and welcoming in the new one, has always been celebrated at this time. Today, however, we see variations to be more on dressing up in more colourful and haunting clothing for the night and well . . . just being with friends for their trick-or treat visits.

It can be said that the modern-day Halloween traditions of pumpkin lanterns, dookin' for apples and trick-or-treating have their origins in the ancient Celtic traditions



## GAELIC SOUL CAKES, THE ORIGINAL TRICK-OR-TREAT


A fact not well known is the practise of 'trick-or-treating' on All Hallows Eve had its origins as an early medieval tradition by both Protestant and Catholic Christians. It was considered an important part of the commemoration to the dead. Soul cakes or Soulmass-cakes (a small round cake) were traditionally baked for Allhallowstide (Halloween, All Saints' Day and All Souls Day) and given out to the soulers, who were mainly children and the poor. They were shared for the souls of the givers, their friends and to the poor. Sharing Soul Cakes went from door to door on the eve of All Hallows or Halloween. Records show that singing and saying prayers to the children formed a part of the ceremony. This practise continued until around the 1930's, although in a few countries this tradition continues.

Charlottesville, Virginia, USA

Some churches invited people to come and receive sweets from them, then prayed for their souls, friends, even pets. In some areas, these Soul Cakes were blessed and in exchange, the receivers had to promise to pray for the soul of a deceased relative. If there were any Soul Cakes left over, they would then be shared out between the distributing families.

## SCOTTISH INVENTIONS - ABSOUTE ZERO - LORD KELVIN THOMSON

In 1848, Lord Kelvin Thomson a Mathematical Physicist of Largs, western Scotland, devised a scale based on the idea that his concept of absolute zero became important. Based in a laboratory at the University of Glasgow, he worked on the laws of thermodynamics and was influential in unifying the emerging discipline of physics in its modern form.

He remained as Professor of Natural Philosophy for over 50 years and was also the first Scottish Scientist to be elevated to the House of Lords

He saw the need for an absolute temperature scale where the lowest possible would be set at zero. Absolute temperatures are marked as units of kelvin. Kelvin is now known for de-

termining its correct value as an absolute minimum temperature.

This scale has now become the standard for scientific measurement, particularly at the high end of temperatures, such as those in stars and at the low end where the motion molecules move more slowly to the point where molecule motion stops altogether. This is zero on the kelvin scale -273.15° Celsius or -459.67° Fahrenheit.
