

HE'S EXTREMELY PROUD TO BE A TURNBULL.. BY NAME

Anthony was born in Durham City in the North East of the UK in 1947. His mother's maiden name was Turnbull. His Grandfather was Alfred Turnbull a police sergeant in the local constabulary.

It was a custom in the family that male members retained the name Turnbull and all his grandchildren and one great grandchild carry the name Turnbull.

Anthony moved to Blackpool, a Northwest UK coastal tourist resort, when he was 14 years old his parents had purchased a small guest house in the town. Anthony had learned to play the guitar and he soon found other musicians in his new home town and began playing in the many clubs, pubs and dance halls that populated the busy holiday destination.





Performing around the entertainment circuits

Over the years, he gained a respectable reputation as a guitarist and singer fronting his own bands in local residencies and social clubs. It wasn't long before he caught the attention of some of the UK's more famous musicians and their managers and in 1972, he moved to London and joined Gerry Rafferty in forming the group 'Stealers Wheel'. Not only did he play most of the guitar and bass tracks on their first highly acclaimed album he also arranged and musically constructed most of the material.

The album was recorded at the Beatles' Apple Studio in London. Geoff Emmerick was the engineer. He was fresh from working with the 'fab four' on their Sgt. Peppers album that had been recorded in the very same studio. Adding to the pedigree of the session, Lieber & Stoller the two songwriters who wrote most of Elvis's hits and many other artistes' chart toppers, were also flown in to produce the album.

Living in London and maintaining a family back in Blackpool was having a financial strain on 'Tony' Together with failed promises from the bands management who were rumoured to be going bankrupt this forced Tony to leave the band and London then return to 'gigging' in his adopted home of Blackpool. *Stealers Wheel* very soon came to a grinding halt and their management disappeared along with substantial record company financial advances.

Tony was once again drawing crowds back in Blackpool with his old band mates until 1978, when he got a call from a long-time friend Barriemore Barlow who was the drummer with Jethro Tull. Their bass player had been taken ill and Tull wanted Tony to join them on their forthcoming North America Tour.

So, in September 1978 Tony was on a British Airways Jet on his way to start a gruelling three month Tour in the USA with one of the biggest bands on the planet. The highlight of the tour was a worldwide live concert by satellite from Madison Square Gardens in New York, the very first of it's kind. The show can still be seen on You Tube and on BBC Cd's and it has become one of Tull's most popular performances.

Back in the UK, Tony picked up with his old band mates and continued to enjoy a successful career on the local circuit. It was during this period that Quentin Tarrantino released his first 'soon to be a block busting film, 'Reservoir Dogs'.

The middle section of the movie featured a rather gory and violent scene involving knives and ears and Tarrantino had personally chosen the music for this most memorable blood-fest. In fact he liked the track so much he actually edited the film to match the track, not the other way around. This was the first time a movie producer had done that.

The track Tarrantino chose was 'Stuck in The Middle With You' by Stealers Wheel, a track that Tony had recorded back in 1972 on the first Stealers Wheel Album. Tony's distinctive guitar and bass arrangements were main features of the track.

Of course, due to the success of the movie, the song became a world-wide hit all over again and the popularity and following of Tony's own band grew as folks wanted to see and hear the guy who had not only been influentially involved in such an iconic track, but had also been a member of Jethro Tull.



After Tony left Tull and while he was working with his own band, he was asked to help with sponsorship at our local zoo. The Director of the Zoo and he became great friends and while he was there he fell in love with Elephants, so much so that he travelled to Arkansas and lived and worked at an elephant sanctuary to learn more and

ended up in India for several months monitoring Elephant movement in the wild. Tony says it's the best job he ever had.

Tony has now retired from live performances, but still enjoys working in his studio. He also became involved with local politics and

was elected to represent a North Sector of Blackpool as well as a 'Leader' of his chosen political group in the Town Hall.

Tony often reflects on his proud heritage and is a keen follower of the Turnbull Clan "Its like being a part of a very large family"

Tony said. "I think we always associate ourselves with our mother's side of the family and I am extremely proud to be a 'Turnbull' and always include it when anyone asks my name."
