NEW BRUNSWICK AVIATION MUSEUM WITH TURNBULL LINK

The future of the New Brunswick Aviation Museum took a major turn on the 1st of April at a Gala dinner where the finished design plans were unveiled for a new building complex.

The Spitfire Design Company of Moncton have been working on exciting plans for our new, multi-million dollar facility, which is to be built on land donated at the airport in Miramichi, New Brunswick.

While the Museum is one component of the new building, a major portion of the facility will be created to introduce students in New Brunswick to STEM (*Science*, *Technology*, *Engineering and Mathematics*) careers, especially those in the aviation and aerospace sectors. These two pillars of our mandate are found in our slogan - Honouring Our Past and Inspiring Our Future.

We received funding from all three levels of government last year to complete a feasibility study and our initial design plans

and we are now working to secure the funds necessary to complete architectural drawings, exhibit design and the construction of the new building.

It is our intention to hire New Brunswick companies to build this facility so we can help the province recover from two years of dealing with the COVID-19 virus.

In addition to the unveiling, the Museum will commemorate a number of milestone anniversaries in New Brunswick aviation history including the 100th anniversary of W. Rupert Turnbull





getting a patent for his variable pitch propeller, the 75th anniversary of Ken Patrick's (Saint John) founding of CAE, the 75th anniversary of helicopter operations in the RCAF, and the 70th anniversary of Forest Protection Limited.

Dreams of Flight helped many New Brunswickers find rewarding careers in the aviation and aerospace fields and we will help instil those same dreams in future generations.



Wallace Rupert Turnbull

One hundred years ago this year, when aviation engineering was still in its early development and fixed pitch propellers were the only option, Wallace Rupert Turnbull, a Canadian Aviation Pioneer from New Brunswick, made his name in history with his new variable pitch propeller mechanism.

Although the variable pitch propellers had been tested for years, it wasn't until 13th March, 1919 when Wallace Turnbull decided to apply for a patent with his design for an automatic variable pitch propeller. On the 29th August, 1922, one hundred years ago, he was granted the patent for his design.

His background as an aviation pioneer was in engineering and an inventor. He graduated in mechanical engineering from Cornwall University in 1893, undertaking post graduate work in physics at the Universities of Berlin and Heidelberg, Germany.





WALLACE TURNBULL'S VARIABLE PITCH PROPELLER

His involvement in aeronautical engineering research spanned over a period of more than four decades, involving many aspects of flight. He built the first wind tunnel in Canada in 1902 and another of his many interests was the development of hydroplanes.

Without doubt, his main contribution to the world of aviation was his invention of the variable pitch propeller. Worldwide it was recognised as a device that has now become a milestone in the evolution of aircraft.

A variable-pitch propeller or controllable-pitch propeller (CPP) is a type of propeller with blades that can be rotated around their long axis, adjusting the blade pitch to suit the flying conditions.

His Variable Pitch Propeller was considered one of the most important developments in aviation history.

When he was posthumously inducted into the Canadian Aviation Hall of Fame, his citation read: "The patent application of his aeronautical theses to a number of problems unique to flight, and more especially his invention of the successful variable pitch propeller, have been of outstanding benefit to Canadian aviation."

NEW NATIONAL PARKS FOR SCOTLAND . . . NEXT STEPS . . .

National Parks constitute the top tier of Scotland's suite of protected landscapes. Scotland has some of the finest scenery in the world, so creating more National Parks is the obvious way to highlight and celebrate this fact.

We welcome the Scottish Government's commitment to designate more National Parks. Community groups in Galloway and the Scottish Borders have already demonstrated clear local community demand for National Parks in those areas.

SCNP and APRS intend to remain closely involved in what will no doubt be a lengthy process of assessment and consultation over the locations, boundaries, powers and functions of the new National Parks. We will continue to stress the need for an overall national strategy and to emphasise that the commitment is to "at least" one new National Park – in other words there could be several.

Although we still consider that up to seven areas could meet the criteria for more National Parks, the proven levels of "local community demand" in the Borders and Galloway mean that these two places are clearly the front runners.

'THE ARTIST'S TOWN' LINK WITH THE SELKIRK GRACE



Surprisingly, 'The Selkirk Grace' has no connection with the town of Selkirk, beyond its name. The town of Selkirk lies 11 miles (15 km) north of Hawick and is one of the oldest Royal Burghs in southeastern Scotland and the site of the earliest settlements in what is now 'The Artist's Town' in the Scottish Borders.

However, the historic Selkirk Arms Hotel at Kirkcudbright, Dumfries and Galloway dates back from 1777 and is situated along the south-western Scottish coastline.

The hotel is known to have had Robert Burns as a lodger on several occasions, around 1794. Although there are conflicting stories as to the origin of **'The Selkirk Grace'**, many believe that it was at this very hotel that Burns penned the famous grace prior to attending at dinner hosted by the Earl of Selkirk at his home on St Mary's Isle.



ARCHAEOLOGICAL DIG FINDINGS AT BEDRULE CASTLE SITE

Public Meeting report sent by Professor Jane Bower, FRSE, Project Manager, 12 Towers of Rule programme

"Bedrule Heritage Project and Beyond - a catchup from the 12 Towers Programme".

The meeting on the evening of the 19th was the first proper, face to face public meeting in the valley of Rulewater since the beginning of the pandemic. "Masks off Day" in Scotland was the day before, Easter Monday, and people appreciated the opportunity for an unmuffled discussion.

Jane Bower introduced, reminding the audience of how the Campaign for a Scottish Borders National Park and the local community had decided on the 12 Towers story as a starting point for exploration of the rich cultural heritage of the Valley.

She briefly listed the achievements of the volunteer individuals and organisations who had managed to work round the restrictions of the pandemic to deliver a growing body of understanding about the raid itself and to identify the many questions still to be answered.

She handed over to Roger Curtis, who is a senior official at Historic Environment Scotland who lives locally and has been very active in the 12 Towers team. Roger gave an excellent exposition of the location and probable architecture of the remains of the many buildings which would have stood in the Valley in the 16th Century.

As he noted, we still have no idea how many people lived in them, and the size of the community is one of the topics we need to explore next. Roger, with the help of an architecture student, has been reconstructing some of the remains of buildings whose foundations he and Archaeology Scotland have been surveying.

Kieran Manchip of Archaeology Scotland spoke next, explaining the exploratory survey work he has been leading (very expertly) at Fulton Tower and Bedrule Castle, where with the help of volunteers he opened up four trenches to start the process of identifying the layout of the Castle.

He and his colleagues will be back in May to do geophysical surveys of the site and the adjoining area, which may conceal the remains of the mediaeval village. Then they will return in the early autumn for more excavation at the site, and if possible at one other site as well.

We were all particularly pleased at the involvement of seven secondary schools and one primary school in the Bedrule excavation and associated workshops. About 120 young people and a goodly number of adults came along to help and to learn about their cultural heritage.

The ensuing discussion considered a number of next steps for the 12 Towers programme. A priority will be to rescue the **towersofrule.co.uk** website, where so much of the information gathered is recorded.

Very sadly, Richard Strathie, who set it up and maintained it, and who has contributed so much to the archaeological and historical research in the area, has passed away. He is very much missed.

The meeting ended on a very positive note with lots of interest in further developments and in the progress of the Campaign for a Scottish Borders National Park.

There will be more news in the following months on the geophysical surveys and their findings and discussions at the Bedrule Castle site. Ed.


