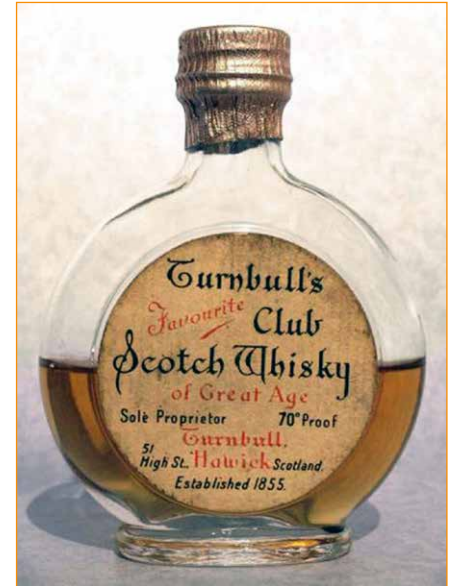

GREAT GREAT GRANDFATHER CELEBRATING HIS 90 YEARS



On 2nd May, James William (Bill) Turnbull celebrated his 90th birthday at a family gathering in Nhulubuy, East Arnhem Land in the Northern Territory, Australia, at the home of Linda Alexander (nee Turnbull). Bill was surrounded by children, grandchildren and three great-grandchildren, with one son and a granddaughter joining in online from Brisbane and Canberra, respectively.

Bill was born in Aylsham, Kent, the son of James William Turnbull senior, originally from Northumberland, a coal miner at the Snowdown colliery, (as they say, "there was a Turnbull down every pit in the UK").

After moving to Luton in the 1950s Bill started a family and in 1966 emigrated to Australia under an immigration scheme which cost only ten pounds for the whole family to emigrate (known in Australia as "ten pound poms"). This branch of the Turnbull family is now spread far and wide over the vast expanse of Australia.

Turnbull Origin Stories

As you may already know, there has been a DNA project hosted with FTDNA since 2006. We are now over 250 members and what started with a collection of male Ydna 12 marker tests, we now welcome both male and female participants and work with both autosomal and Ydna tests.

We have several members who have upgraded to the BigY 700 and we now have at least one branch, R-FT155105, on the tree of mankind. We added our own website, created a private Facebook group, collectively managed a spreadsheet for project members and offered online Turnbull Talks where we worked through matches and speculated about origins.

We used two tools to first group our members and then created a phylogenetic tree for the Y testers. We studied these charts and started to see some interesting trends. We discovered that our testers generally belonged to the R-M269 Haplogroup, along with most of Western Europe. Some belong to R-L21 which is generally regarded as the Haplogroup of the so-called Scots-Irish and is a subclade of R-M269.

The first pattern that we collectively observed was among a group that we call "*The Usual Suspects*" because they constantly show up as matches to largest group of Y DNA Testers at all marker levels. Six of them have also taken the Big-Y test and have firmly established the Turnbull branch in the tree of mankind, which appears to go back about 450 years, or roughly mid 16th century. We believe these Turnbolls all descend from a common ancestor, who may have been based in Jedburgh.

We currently have 53 members that we consider Trimbles and have discovered that not all Trimbles have a common origin. One of the myths about our surname is that those Turnbolls who went to the Ulster plantations, changed their name to Trimble to obtain land.

Turnbulls in Business

My part of the Turnbull family has a long history in Lancashire in the north of the United Kingdom, in textiles.

The history of the firm in the early twentieth century was vividly recalled by the late Joyce Turnbull, the 17th grandchild of the co-founder who lived next door to Mrs Alferoff of the Stockdale side, in Edenfield. She was the 17th grandchild of the co-founder William Turnbull, the company being founded by him in 1881.

With justified pride in the traditional block printed fabrics created by Turnbull & Stockdale Ltd, she also recollected that many were used in the Cunard liners, that Queen Mary (*wife of George V*) liked the delphinium pattern especially, and that Prince Philip appropriately had the Queen's Navee design in his study, whilst the cottage in Windsor Great Park given to Princess Elizabeth by the Welsh people also used some. Some fabrics were also on the ship Titanic.



Former Mayor, Philip Dunne, recalls that the founder William Turnbull was the practical process developer, whereas William Stockdale was his financial and commercial partner.

Turnbull & Stockdale has now been succeeded by a number of brands that supply leading design houses and interior designers worldwide under the Turnbull Prints parent company, which at its heart, preserves hand-block printing and a broad range of specialist printing activities including screen and the latest digital technology. We're the last company in the world with the skillset to create these complex hand block prints.

Hand block prints on fabric simply cannot be replicated by machinery - it would be the equivalent of comparing an original oil

painting with a printed replica. The beauty of block-prints lies in it's imperfections. It is where the head, heart, and the hand come together in unison.

Hand block printing is unique due to the bespoke nature of each repeat, as different amounts of colour are picked-up, placed in slightly different positions on the design, and struck with different amounts of pressure. Colours overlap, the dye swells to the edges during printing leading to the characterful variation in shade, and the block-cutters cleverly combined layers of colour or 'fall-ons' to create additional interest. Every printing is unique, and no two repeats will ever be the same with this hand-crafted technique.

The Turnbull Archive is regarded by academics and historians as of international importance and today includes not only thousands of designs and documents, but also the textile reference library of the UK's National Trust. More designs continue to be added. It includes original designs by Lewis F Day, a contemporary of William Morris who was Design Director for Turnbull & Stockdale, as well as numerous other famous designers. Ongoing work examines the techniques, such as shadow tissues, pioneered by the firm.

The comprehensive Turnbull & Stockdale reference library provides dates and manufacturing details about the patterns and represents a key resource for those seeking to recreate a historically accurate look, in some cases recreating the authentic colour combinations.

Restoration and preservation of many of the pieces is currently being undertaken, allowing for a greater number of fragile patterns to become available and accessed via electronic means.



COMMON RIDINGS CORNET NAMED FOR 2022

A large crowd of more than 200 Teries, young and old, gathered in Beaconsfield Terrace on a Wednesday night in May when Greig Middlemass took up the reins as this year's Cornet. The three day event was held on Thursday 9, Friday 10 and Saturday 11 June.

On a dry, sunny evening, Halberdier Keith Douglas-Hogg, escorted by the Drum and Fife Band, delivered the all-important letter from Provost Watson McAteer, inviting the 26-year-old to carry the Banner Blue.

The coronavirus pandemic had put paid to almost all of the celebrations and ceremonies since 2019 but now Teri blood has stirred with Picking Night kick-starting the countdown to a much-anticipated Common-Riding.

Proceedings followed time-honoured tradition with a 'strive' for the waiting youngsters, after which the Cornet was joined by his Right and Left, Connor Brunton and Gareth Renwick, and Acting Father Alan Brown, to lead hundreds of excited schoolchildren and adults on the customary walk around the town.

The Saxhorn Band met the walkers at the library, leading the way to the town hall smoker.

Speaking to The Hawick Paper, Cornet Middlemass said: "We have finally arrived [at Common-Riding 2022]. We got there at last." He added: "The reception outside the house was absolutely brilliant." The 26-year-old was the toast of the town on Wednesday evening after being named 2022 Cornet. "It has been a long time coming,"

he conceded, with the normality of the last two years' ceremonies hit by the pandemic.

"Wednesday was a brilliant night."

Greig has been a long-time supporter of the annual event, having first followed Cornet Jamie Turnbull when he was just nine years old, riding his own pony, Phoebe. It was also in 2005 that he secured his Mosstroopers badge, and he has remained a loyal follower ever since. "It really is a childhood dream, and I can't wait to live my dream," he enthused. His mount throughout the festivities will be a hirling from Kailzie Equestrian at Peebles.

"I don't know yet which horse I will be riding, but it's down to a choice of two," he explained.

The former Drumlanrig primary and high school pupil worked at Hawico for seven years and is now employed in the stockroom at William Lockie.

Greig, who has a 21-year-old brother Ryan, is the elder son of Gary and Beverley Middlemass. He said: "I'm just looking forward to everything; Principals from the other towns coming to visit, all the ceremonies, the ride-outs and all the other events. "There is a real buzz and it's great to see the whole town coming together again."

His Lass is his 24-year-old girlfriend, Emma Gibson from Kelso. The former Broomlands primary and Kelso High School pupil works as an HR adviser for Scottish Borders Council's case management team.

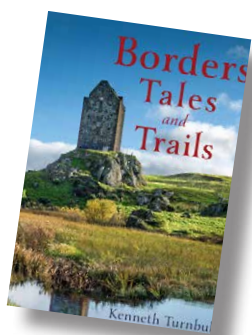

Canada - Musical journey to a magical career



An accomplished singer and songwriter of Canadian folk music, Robbie Turnbull is busy inspiring the West Kootenay music scene. He, an alumnus of Seven Summits Centre For Learning in Rossland, is an accomplished singer and songwriter of Canadian folk music. "I would describe my music as a fusion of classic folk, Celtic, and with a touch of jazz. The direction and elements I include depend on the song," says Turnbull. "The lyrics will direct the instrumentation." Turnbull's first public releases included several singles in the Autumn of 2021. His debut album titled "Revelry & Retribution" is a collection of songs that offer a symbolic musical tour. He writes his music with the care and precision of a classical poet. "I aim to write music lyrics that are independent so they can be read as well as sung."

Australia - ASX-listed company board role

After a break of 4½ years, Lucy Turnbull, lawyer, philanthropist and businesswoman has rejoined the biotechnology company Immutep as non-executive director. Initially she played an influential role in Immutep's pivotal decision to switch from being a single product cancer vaccine developer to a multi-product LAG-3 immunotherapy company. "I was sad to leave the company, but I had a lot of other balls in the air and the Greater Sydney Commission was taking up huge amounts of my time. Ms Turnbull said continued efforts were needed to improve the focus of women taking up careers including science, technology, engineering and maths.



UK- World's biggest bottle of whisky auctioned



The world's largest Scotch whisky bottle, 'Intrepid', went under the hammer on 25th May. It is taller than most men, and stands at 5 feet 11" (1.8 metres) in height. It was filled with a record breaking 311 litres (82.16 U.S. gallons) of Macallan Single Malt whisky. Edinburgh-based Lyon & Turnbull auctioned the bottle containing the equivalent of 444 standard bottles. The Intrepid was officially certified by Guinness World Records when it was bottled in 2021 after maturing in 2 sister casks in Macallan's Speyside warehouse for 32 years. Auctioneers said according to 'The Scotsman', the bottle of whisky sold for £1.1 million (\$1.38 million US / \$1.9 million AU / \$2 million NZ).

UK – Just ask the right questions

Ex-war crimes investigator Ron Turnbull, 74 and retired, has been speaking with his former colleagues about the alleged



atrocities in Ukrainian cities such as Bucha and says that a dead body can talk if you ask the correct questions of it. Only then, can they determine what happened and in doing so, speak out on the person's behalf to secure some sort of justice. "These people were treated inhumanely and they're never going to have a voice," he comments "Our job was to give them that voice, and be able to determine how they were killed."

Scotland – Cash for a cause



As part of her bid to complete 20 physical challenges this year in aid of SAMH (Scottish Association for Mental Health) Megan Turnbull a Teacher from Barrhead in East Renfrewshire, took on the Edinburgh Marathon in May, to coin in cash for a cause that is close to her heart. The 26.2 mile route past the capital's iconic landmarks and along the picturesque East Lothian coast, was the midway point in her efforts. Megan has coined in more than £2,000 for SAMH since she began supporting the charity.

USA - Promoted to global CEO

Tyler Turnbull has been promoted to global CEO of Foote, Cone & Belding (FCB) in North America.

DNA TESTING BRINGS SOME SURPRISING RESULTS

Many of our Trimbles descend from a group known in America as the Five Trimble brothers who emigrated together from Ulster to North America in about 1720.

Their North American lineage is well-documented but their origins before about 1700 are uncertain. They generally fit with other members of the project but recently one of them took the Big Y test and we were shocked to see a completely new Haplogroup emerge in the Tree of Mankind R-BY34935.

We are hoping to have another member upgrade soon to determine if this is an aberration for one of the brothers or if the whole group may have a different origin story.

Through our collective research we have been able to group both male and female Trimbles into several groups with roots in Ulster, one line going back to 1590 in Antrim. Other Trimbles clearly line up with Turnbolls in our core group and suggest that they simply are a spelling variation.

Another distinct group that has shown up are descendants of John Bull, born about 1754 in Virginia, USA. Family lore says that they were originally called Turnbull and within two generations had reverted to the original surname. It's confusing because we now have several different surnames associated with this line but they don't all match each other.

Surnames in this group include Buhl, Turnbull, Randall, Ball, and Benjamin and all seem to have connections to Tennessee and Virginia. They match each other at varying levels of testing, but don't match any other Turnbull groups which is quite puzzling and frustrating in trying to take their research back further.

One of our more interesting Turnbull mysteries has been that of Thomas Turnbull and Jean Mackay who landed in Prince Edward Island, Canada aboard the Lovely Nellie. While The Lovely Nellie sailed initially from Annan in 1776, these Turnbolls boarded from the Isle of Man, although it was said that they were "not from this place". They eventually settled in McLellan's Brook, Nova Scotia and established a well-documented dynasty from there. It has always been a bit of contention as just where Thomas came from.

Some assumed Annan because that was the original port that the Lovely Nellie sailed from and speculated that the first children were born there. We persuaded several known descendants to take the Ydna test and were surprised when the results revealed yet another Haplogroup namely I-M253. This suggests Viking heritage but is often found among the Irish. However, what we do know is that they do match each other, but are a distinct branch of our larger Turnbull tree.

One of the other enduring mysteries in Turnbull lore, is the origin of John Turnbull, born around 1748 but who emigrated to Australia in 1801 aboard the Coromandel. All we really know about him is that he sailed from London and throughout his long life had several spouses. Once in Australia he established another Turnbull dynasty which includes the former Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull.

While we have had several descendants join the project they are all autosomal testers and they don't match each other. This isn't terribly surprising because autosomal testing is really only reliable to about 4th cousins and these Turnbolls seem to have shorter generational lengths. I'm still hunting for a Y tester to see if they match my father so we can settle this once and for all.

We managed to recruit some Rules into the project because they were also intrigued as to whether or not there was a connection. As far as they were concerned Rule was an English surname but they also knew of the Rulewater in the Scottish borders, but could find no connection. So far they do not match anyone else in the project. In addition, we have searched the trees of every other project member and find no Rules. Draw your own conclusions.

Some new research lines were established based upon Robson's speculation about the origins of the Turnbolls coming from the de Tremblays of France. We recruited several Tremblay, Trombley, de Tremblay testers and at this time we simply cannot rule them out as connecting to the Turnbolls. They all belong to Haplogroup R-M269 and claim French origins. Until one of them takes BigY we cannot know for sure whether we all belong together or not.

So where does that leave us in our hunt for Turnbull origins? From a DNA perspective, we really need Turnbolls and Trimbles who didn't emigrate to consider joining our project. FTDNA frequently offer sales and Ydna testers who know their lineage would help us sort out the various lines. It might also show up some lines that we have not as yet been explored.

If you already belong to project, consider upgrading your test to BigY and/or adding an autosomal test. Also add a family tree to your account, because DNA results work with a paper trail and traditional genealogical research. If you have taken a test with another services such as Ancestry or 23andMe, then consider exporting your results free of charge and joining the project. Meanwhile we will continue exploring the Tremblay connection and keep hunting for Rules that match Turnbolls. But perhaps the most exciting results we await are deeper testing of the Trimble lines.

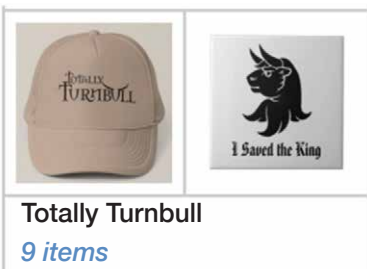

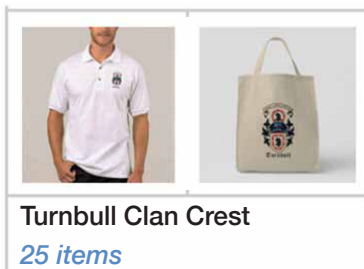
