Later research by a Mary Brocklehurst contradicts this and claims the following: Married: 30/11/1874, St. Saviours Church of England, Goulburn; **Rebecca Hettie Hines,** from Norwood. George (no Charles on the Marriage Certificate,) is shown as a laborer from Norwood at the time of his marriage.

Died: 8/11/1925, Liverpool, N.S.W. Buried 10/11/1925, at Church of England Cemetery, Liverpool, N.S.W.

I however have a copy of this George Brown's death Certificate which shows his parents as an <u>Edward</u> William Brown, Shoemaker and <u>Isabel</u> Brown as his mother. To add further to the confusion, in a Bicentennial Book of Australian Pioneers Rebecca Hettie <u>Hynes</u> is shown as George Charles Brown's wife and his children are shown as the 5 children listed above with Catherine.

HISTORY:

William Brown's origins still require further English research. There are two strong possibilities:

(A) Earlier family research in 1985 by some of his descendants believed a William Browne, Baptised 17/1/1803 at Thorpe, outside Norwich, Norfolk, England, the son of William Browne (1778 – 1838) and Elizabeth Wyard (1773 – 1808) with a brother and 3 sisters was our William. I have some other details on them but have not included them as I believe this is the wrong William Brown.

(B) There is however a William Brown, Baptised at St. Stevens Norwich, the son of James Brown and Sarah Negus (no other dates or information known at this stage.) This seems more than likely to be our William as 3 of William's children have names of James, Sarah and Negus, which is much more than a coincidence. Further, our William's Death Certificate shows his father as a William Brown (no "e") Nurseryman. The certificate however also contains numerous errors, from information supplied by an unknown informant.

From William Brown's Convict records we do know that he was born at Norwich in Norfolk, England and was an apprentice Shoemaker for 2 years prior to being convicted of larceny, at Norwich Quarter Sessions on the 11/4/1820. At the time of his conviction he is shown as aged 20 years, 5 ft 3 ½ inches tall, had a sallow (pale) complexion, black hair and hazel eyes. William was convicted together with James Asker, also of Norwich, a weaver, 18 years old, 5' 6 ½", ruddy complexion, light brown hair and hazel eyes. Both were sentenced to transportation for 7 years. Norwich Quarter Sessions Minute Book, Volume 27 at the Norfolk Record Office further shows:

To be transported to such place or places Beyond the Seas as His Majesty by the Advice of his Privy Council shall order and direct for the term of seven years.

<u>Note:</u> Victims of pickpockets are unable to identify their money which is stolen, however their "silk handkerchiefs," which were used as we would a wallet or purse today, provided the evidence that the Court could use for a conviction.

On the 18/8/1820, William Brown and James Asker departed the Port of Downs, England as convicts aboard the vessel "Elizabeth 1" on her 3rd voyage to N.S.W., with William Osler as Master and Samuel Alexander as Surgeon Superintendent. They arrived in Sydney Cove on the 31/12/1820. James Asker had been assigned to a Government Factory at Liverpool, possibly a jail or asylum, while it appears William was assigned as a convict servant. In Letters & Petitions received by the Colonial Secretary 1789 – 1826, there is a letter from Mansfield, dated 8/6/1823, requesting that his assigned convict servant, William Brown be allowed to accompany him to Hobart Town.

The records of the Colonial Secretary further reveal an application for permission to marry dated 16/11/1825. Convict William Brown, shown as age 22 (more likely 25years,) married Elizabeth Catherine Foss (aged 15 years 10months but shown as 16 years, free-born in the Colony,) on 28/11/1825 at St. James Church of England, King St., Sydney by Banns. The Rev. Richard Hill was the Minister and the witnesses were Anne & Benjamin Smith (Elizabeth's mother & her second husband.) William and Elizabeth's first four children, namely William Benjamin Henry, Henrietta, Mary Ann and James were baptized in this same church in later years as well as their sister Maria Charlotte and possibly other siblings.

William received his Ticket of Leave (Certificate of Freedom) in N.S.W. on 12/4/1827, where he is shown as 27 years old. At this time his description remains unchanged from that shown at his conviction. James Asker however, now 24 years, is 5' 10 ¼", fair ruddy, with light sandy brown hair, hazel & small eyes. He had also lost a front tooth in a public row.

The following year, with the birth of the first of their eleven children, William and Elizabeth were living in Elizabeth St. Sydney, where William had returned to his old trade as a shoemaker. In the ensuring years William lived at Surrey Hills, King & Market Streets, Lane Cove, Cooks River, Chippendale, Botany and finally Shellharbour. He also went from being a Shoemaker to a Settler, possibly a Publican (but unlikely,) Shopkeeper, and a Settler again before eventually establishing himself as a Gardener for the last 17years of his life.

It is believed William and Elizabeth visited England somewhere between 1847 – 1853 where John Edward Brown was born. Elizabeth died on the 12/12/1854 (aged 44 years) leaving William still with 5 young children between the ages of 1 and 11 years of age. His oldest son William Benjamin Henry Brown and wife Sarah (with 2 infant children of their own) took on the responsibility of helping raise these children.

William died at Shellharbour on 15/7/1872 aged 71 years from apoplexy (stroke.) Henry South JP, Coroner of Kiama, certified his death. On the 16/7/1872, William's body was buried at the Shellharbour cemetery by George Rankin, undertaker. Witnesses to the burial were James Williamson (most likely William

Benjamin Henry Brown's brother-in-law) and a James Condon. The information on William's Death Certificate (provided by an unknown informant,) shows him as a shoemaker, 49 years in N.S.W. (correct figure 52 years,) and with only 5 male and 3 female children living and 1 male child dead which is also incorrect. What is indisputable however is that William Brown with his wife Elizabeth established a dynasty of Brown descendants, who were all pioneers in this new country Australia.

MISCELLANOUS:

- (A) Some of this information on **William Brown's Children & Grandchildren** is also contained in a Bicentennial Book of Australian Pioneers, which has numerous errors. These errors are due in part to the repeated use of various common names given to brothers, cousins, uncle's etc., incorrect research, plus transcribing of some information. Details have been updated with the correct information where Birth, Death, Marriage Certificates etc. can substantiate these new details. Descendents of William Brown owe an enormous debt of gratitude to past family historian descendents: Lynette Brown of Griffith N.S.W., Elaine Laughton in Tasmania, Eileen Bowden of Miranda N.S.W. (who added to Lynette's work) and Velloa Brown of Mcdowall Q'LD for their tireless and painstaking manual research in the 1980's and earlier.
- (B) The extensive details of the grandchildren and extended family connections of William Brown & Elizabeth Catherine (Foss) Brown, I have endeavored to unravel from conflicting previous family research and have also included, where possible, to give assistance to future generations reading this document who may be also trying to establish their lineage with this Australian Pioneering couple.
- (C) While researching the location of Gegedzerick, by chance I came across the Turnbull Clan Association (TCA) website www.turnbullclan.com which has a fantastic genealogy database that includes numerous details (although some appear incorrect) of our William Brown's children: Frederick, Sarah & Maria Charlotte plus their extended families. Details (where applicable,) from this database I have shown in Italic's with their TCA references. I have also sent their webmaster a copy of this document to help their research and perhaps clarify some areas of confusion.
- (D) Government Records Abbreviations: CF Came Free, GS Government Servant (Convict,) FS – Free by Servitude, AP – Absolute Pardon, TL – Ticket of Leave, BC – Born in the Colony, NE – Never Emigrated.
- (E) A word of helpful advice to all Family Historians researching our William Brown shown above... take extreme care you research the correct William Brown who arrived in the colony as a convict aboard the vessel

- "Elizabeth 1" on her 3rd voyage to N.S.W. Numerous ships from the first fleet onwards have a William Brown or William Browne listed among their convicts, soldiers, settlers & passengers and it is easy to make a mistake.
- (F) Some "general location directions" to assist you: Bulli on the South Coast is north of Wollongong, New South Wales, almost in the middle of the Illawarra District. Cataract River is near Bulli. Horsley, also known as West Dapto, is now a suburb of Wollongong. Dapto is south-west of Wollongong. Brownsville is near Dapto. Shellharbour is south-east of Dapto. Jamberoo, Kiama & Kiama Heights are all roughly south of Shellharbour. Adaminably was a rural town that was flooded over by Lake Eucumbene (Snowy Mountains,) Jejedzrick or Gegedzerick is now Berridale, also Snowy Mountains area.
