a Notary Public in and for the same duly commissioned and qualified Personally
Came and appeared John Turnbull of said Parish and State who declared that he
does by these presents acknowledge Mary a girl of Mulatto color aged about seven
years, Eliza a girl of Mulatto color aged about six years, Dudley a boy of Mulatto
color aged about four years, Charles a boy of Mulatto color aged about two years,
and Minerva a girl of Mulatto color aged about five months to be his children
by him begotten of their mother Rachael a Mulattoes or Giffe aged about twenty
three years, said children and their mother being now his slaves.

In testimony of all which the said John Turnbull has hereto signed his name in
the presence of Uriah B. Phillips and Lewis E. Turner and of me said Notary on
the day and year first above written, the above witnesses being of lawful age and
domiciliated in said Parish, Given under my hand the impress of my Seal of Office
