HE WARNS, HOWEVER, THAT MOST PEOPLE WHO BEGIN LOOK-ING INTO THE FAMILY TREE HAVE NO NOTION OF WHAT MAY BE LURKING IN ITS BRANCHES AND THAT ONE IS APT TO FIND MORE VILLIANS THAN HEROES OR HEROINES. LET US KNOW THE STOCK WHENCE WE CAME. WE SHALL THEN KNOW SOMETHING OF OURSELVES".

## EARLY TURNBULL HISTORY

The following section was prepared by John F. Turnbull of Bramshott Farm, Orillia, Ontario.

In 1959, Mr. Turnbull prepared a book on the Turnbull family to which he belonged, most of whom settled around Digby, Nova Scotia.

Thanks are extended to his family for permission to include the introductory section of his book as part of this Turnbull history.

As a matter of interest, John F. Turnbull's son, James D. Turnbull married Jean Scott who boarded, while going to High School in Peterborough, Ontario, with our friend, Alice (Riley) Turnbull. Alice's husband, Lieutenant Colonel James Turnbull was overseas in World War 11. Alice and Jim had a son, James Riley Turnbull. It so happens that Velma and I were next door neighbours during the 1940's. So, here we had James Turnbull, James Riley Turnbull and James Ross Turnbull in the two houses as well as James D. Turnbull when he and Jean came to visit Alice. A book could be written about interesting incidents which involved the two households where two James R. Turnbulls and one James Turnbull lived -- all referred to as "Jim".

## INTRODUCTION

In 1860, Thos. Turnbull, a widower and native of Roxburgh-shire, Scotland, came to Canada with eight of his children. His second oldest son, Andrew, had come to Canada in 1856.

Thos. settled on Lot 8, Concession 15, Township of Grey, Huron County, Province of Ontario. Andrew settled on Lot 10, Concession 15, Grey Twp. This was largely uncleared land, covered mostly, by hardwood bush, such as Maple, Beech, Ash. Elm. etc..

Over the years, there have been many stories, anecdotes, etc. of family history recorded by various members and held within individual branches.

To my knowledge, to date (1987), there has not been a comprehensive collection of family records and history. In recent years, several of my great Neices and Nephews, now in their 30's, have asked for information of their ancestors and present relatives. I am sure that the same thing is happening within other branches of the family.

According to my information, there are, as of Dec. 1986, only twelve Great Grandchildren of Thos. Turnbull, 1788-1883, who are living, ranging in age from 62 years to 90. Eight of these twelve are Grandchildren of Andrew. the other four Grandchildren, of Adam. There are no living descendants of the other seven children of Thos.. As a result, in 1986, I conceived the idea of preparing a statistical record of Great Grandfather's descendants and to gather together family history which was available.

The response to my questionnaire has been excellent and as of Feb. 1987, I have a record of all descendants to Dec. 1985.

A chart has been prepared for each descendant, numbered and indexed, alphabetically and numerically. The system is designed that it may be continued into the future.

The narrative collection will be separate to the statistical records - each compatible but repetitious to some extent.

As long as I am able, I would be pleased to keep the statistical record up-to-date if advised of births, deaths, marriages, etc. and include in the narrative section any research articles or records which have been done by other members of the family.

For the assistance in putting this exercise together, I wish to thank my wife, Velma; my sister, Jean (Turnbull) Buchanan; my cousins, Margaret (Turnbull) Gow; Dr. Ian Turnbull; Viola (Turnbull) Lamont and all others who have made this, possible.
