They had eleven children, nine girls and two boys. My father's mother was Caroline Isabell the ninth daughter and eleventh child. The boys had no children. I do have the contact with descendants of my grandmother's sister Marion. They are first Crane then Lyon etc.

My particular interest is some information about JOHN TURNBULL'S family back of 1776 when he was born. Do you have any information about your Turnbull connections back that far?

My father was the only child who lived to manhood. I had two sisters. I have two sons and a daughter. My one son is named after me and he has only two daughters. Other son has a son and daughter. My daughter has three sons.

Since I was born in 1896 I may not be around too long, but so far am in fairly good health. My wonderful wife died just four years ago.

I did not have your address except that it was Charlotte. I have many cousins at Black Mountain on my mother's side. Her sister married a Talmage and they are as sands of the desert. My mother was a Crane. That that Mrs. Berk would forward this to you.
